

The Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District (CUWCD) held a Workshop and Board meeting at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 13, 2023, at the Clearwater UWCD Building, located at 700 Kennedy Court, Belton, Texas.

Workshop opened with President, Leland Gersbach at 1:35 p.m.

Workshop item #1: Receive information related to the 88th Legislative Session and Groundwater Legislation.

Leland noted for the record that the Board would enter into Executive Session with the District's legal team under attorney/client privilege to discuss information related to the 88th Legislative Session and Groundwater Legislation.

Executive Session convened with President, Leland Gersbach at 1:36 p.m.

Executive Session closed and Regular Board meeting convened with President, Leland Gersbach, at 2:05 p.m.

- 1. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance. Director, Jody Williams, gave the invocation. Secretary, Gary Young, led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2. Public Comment. None.

3. Approve minutes of the May 10, 2023, Board meeting.

Board members received the minutes of the May 10, 2023, Board meeting and workshop in their Board packet to review prior to the meeting.

Secretary, Gary Young, moved to approve the minutes of the May 10, 2023, Board meeting and Workshop as presented. Vice President, Jody Williams, seconded the motion.

Motion carried 4-0 (1 absent).

(Leland requested the Board skip to agenda items 11 & 12 at this time. The Board agreed)

11. Discuss, consider, and take appropriate action, if necessary, related to the TCEQ-TPDES Permit WQ0016294001 by Mustan Springs Utility LLC to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 928,000 gallons per day from the plant site to an unnamed tributary, to Buttermilk Creek, leading to Salado Creek.

Leland noted for the record that Director, Scott Brooks, had recused himself from discussion or comments on this item due to a business relationship with the applicant.

Dirk explained that CUWCD was notified by Rep. Buckley's office of a permit application notice, due to his constituents' concerns, on May 9, 2023. CUWCD was not notified by TCEQ. Rep. Buckley notified TCEQ that he wants a public hearing on the application to be held in Salado by TCEQ and the Applicants. Dirk spoke with TCEQ staff on 6/9/23 and they stated that the comment period is still open. Dirk requested a review of the application in its entirety by legal counsel and the District geoscience consultant. There needs to be a formal discussion on the timeline to offer comments and time to respond to local concerns by landowners, private well owners, and public water suppliers in the Salado area.

Dirk noted that CUWCD has had multiple inquiries from local citizens about the potential impact on recharge, water quality at the Spring Complex, and public water supply wells.

Dirk commented that after reviewing the application, timeline, and facts related to the application, Dirk, legal counsel, and geoscience consultants have prepared formal comments and recommend that the District provide public comment, participate in the public meeting with local legislators and request a contested case hearing.

Leland opened the floor to those wishing to make public comments on the TCEQ applications. He allowed each person that signed up to comment time to voice their concerns. He received comments and concerns from: Susan Edens, David Jones, Richard Frith, Steve Campbell, Janet Kennedy, and Sandra Blankenship.

Vice President, Jody Williams, moved to authorize General Manager to submit formal comments and letter requesting a contested case hearing. Secretary, Gary Young, seconded the motion.

Motion carried 3-0 (1 recused, 1 absent). Leland noted for the record that there was a quorum for the vote.

12. Discuss, consider, and take appropriate action, if necessary, related to the TCEQ-TPDES Permit WQ0016310001 by South Central Water Company to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 700,000 gallons per day from the plant site directly to Salado Creek. Leland noted for the record that Director, Scott Brooks, had recused himself from discussion or comments on

this item due to a business relationship with the applicant.

Dirk explained that he notified Rep. Buckley's office of this permit application notice and due to the District's concerns, Rep. Buckley has agreed to request a public hearing. Rep Buckley notified TCEQ on May 10, 2023, that he wants a public hearing on the application to be held in Salado by TCEQ and the Applicants.

Dirk has not requested a review of the application in its entirety by legal counsel and the District geoscience consultant. There needs to be a formal discussion on the timeline to offer comments and time to respond to local concerns by landowners, private well owners, and public water suppliers in the Salado area.

Dirk noted that CUWCD has had several inquiries from local citizens about the potential impact on recharge, water quality at the Spring Complex, and public water supply wells.

Dirk commented that after reviewing the application, timeline, and facts related to the application, Dirk, legal counsel, and geoscience consultants can prepare formal comments and recommendations, provide public comment, participate in the public meeting with local legislators, and request a contested case hearing.

Vice President, Jody Williams, moved to authorize General Manager to submit formal comments and a letter with the help of legal counsel and the geoscience team, requesting a contested case hearing. Secretary, Gary Young, seconded the motion.

<u>Workshop item #2:</u> Receive briefing on the City of Killeen Sewage spill into Reece Creek as it relates to well owners. Dirk briefed the Board on the sewage spill into Reece Creek and his suggestions moving forward to work with local well drillers and pump installers to proactively disinfect the wells at the City's expense.





Agenda Item #9:


Discuss, consider, and take appropriate action, if necessary, to approve both an encumbrance agreement and shared well agreement between Mr. James Boger and adjacent property owners Mr. James & Mrs. Raynesa Jonas in order that Mr. Boger can pursue a future permit application for a non-exempt Combination Drilling/Operating permit for a new well on a tract of land less than 2-acres.

Narrative:

The history of the need to assist Mr. Boger with groundwater is a result of the USAC removing pumps from the lake.

In 2015 he applied for an exempt well for a tract of land less than 2 acres.

He was denied the exempt well from the District due to subdivision of the (PID: 367119) tract to less than 2-acres occurred after March 1, 2004. He is presenting an <u>encumbrance agreement</u> to increase the tract size to 2.728-acres so that the property is now eligible for a non-exempt well. The granting party wishes to also have a <u>shared well agreement</u> for the purpose of both parties having access to groundwater.



Recommendation:

Request the Board review all of the signed documents that necessitated the payment of \$100.00 for each document to be signed, notarized and recorded with the District and each warranty deed upon approval of the Board today. Remind Mr. Boger to apply for a non-exempt well with the District to go to a public hearing in the near future. Staff will assist Mr. Boger with this task.

Approve both the encumbrance agreement and shared well agreement as presented.





SHARED WELL AGREEMENT

This Agreement, made and entered into this 30th day of 9th 2023 by and between <u>James Boger</u>, party of the first part, hereinafter referred to as the "supplying party", and <u>Jason & Raynesa Jonas</u>, party of the second part, and hereinafter referred to as the "supplied party":

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the supplying party is now the owner of property known as <u>367119</u> (Property ID, Attachment A), located in the County of Bell, State of Texas which property is owned by <u>James Boger</u> and recorded with Appraisal District of Bell County and

WHEREAS, the supplied party is the owner of <u>8540</u> (Property ID, Attachment B), located in the County of Bell, State of Texas, which property is owned by <u>Jason & Raynesa Jonas</u> and recorded with the Appraisal District of Bell County and

WHEREAS, the undersigned parties deem it necessary to provide a well system to service the parcels described herein, and an Agreement has been reached relative to supplying water from the well and the cost of supplying said water; and

WHEREAS, there is located a well upon <u>367119</u> (Property ID) <u>31.159997</u> Latitude, <u>97.477239</u> ongitude, CUWCD Well Number <u>E-23-044P</u>, approved by Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District (CUWCD) and properly registered and constructed in accordance with CUWCD Rules, together with water distribution facilities, hereinafter referred to as "water well and distribution system", for the purpose of supplying water to all properties connected to the said water distribution system; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention and purpose of the undersigned parties that the well and water distribution system shall be used and operated to provide an adequate supply of water for each of the properties connected thereto, for the domestic consumption of the occupants of said properties, and to assure the continuous and satisfactory operation and maintenance of the well and water distribution system for the benefit of the present and future owners, their heirs, successors and assigns of the properties connected thereto; and

WHEREAS, the said well is deemed by the parties hereto to be of adequate capacity to supply a single-family dwelling on each of the parcels described herein with water from the well for all domestic uses of a single family residing therein; and

WHEREAS, the water from the well has undergone a water quality analysis from a certified water testing lab and has been determined by the certified lab to supply safe and potable water; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to enter this Agreement for the purpose of reducing to writing their respective rights and obligations pertaining to said well and water distribution system.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and covenants herein contained, it is agreed that the well and water distribution system situated on <u>367119</u> (Property ID) shall be used by the parties to this Agreement, as well as by all future owners and occupants of said parcels, upon the following terms and conditions:

1. That until this Agreement is terminated, as hereinafter provided, the parties hereto, their heirs, successors and assigns, for the exclusive benefit of the respective parcels of real estate, and for the exclusive use of the household residing thereon, are hereby granted the right in common with the other parties to this Agreement, to draw water from the well domestic use, as described in the Clearwater UWCD Rules and Regulation of Domestic USE.

2. That the owners or residents of the dwellings located on <u>8540</u> (Parcel ID), as of the date of this Agreement shall:

a. Not pay or cause to be paid to the supplying party for this use of the well and water distribution system.

b. Pay or cause to be paid promptly, a proportionate share of all expenses for the operation and maintenance of the well and water distribution system that may become necessary. Each respective share shall be determined by dividing the amount of each expense by two, it being understood that the supplying party and the supplied party shall pay an amount equal to one half of the total of such necessary repair or replacement. Shared expenses include the cost of electricity for pumping, repairs and maintenance on said well and water distribution system.

3. That the cost of any removal or replacement of pre-existing site improvements on an individual parcel necessary for system operation, maintenance, replacement, improvements, inspection or testing, damaged as a result of repair of the well or water distribution system maintenance will be borne by the owner of the affected parcel, except that costs to remove and replace common boundary fencing or walls damaged as a result of repair shall be shared equally between or among parties so damaged.

4. That each of the parties hereby agrees that they will promptly repair, maintain and replace all water pipes or mains serving their respective dwellings.

5. That the consent of all parties to pay a proportionate share of costs shall be obtained prior to embarking upon expenditures for system maintenance, replacement or improvement, except in emergency situations. An arbitrator shall be chosen by the parties; shall be consulted in the event the parties cannot agree regarding the said expenditures; and the arbitrator's decision shall be definitive.

6. That the supplied party shall pay to the supplying party his proportionate share for the cost of energy for the operation of the pumping equipment. This cost shall be determined by a separate meter upon each dwelling and for each parcel.

7. That it is the agreement of the parties hereto that the payment for energy cost shall be made not later than the 5^{th} day of each succeeding month during the term of this Agreement. In the event that any such payment remains unpaid for a period of <u>20</u> days, the supplying party may terminate the supply of water to the supplied party until all arrearages in payment are received by the supplying party.

8. That it is the agreement of the parties that they shall permit a third party to cure a default of payment or other obligation and shall permit water distribution service to be reinstated upon such curative action.

9. That each party shall have the right to act to correct an emergency situation and shall have access to the pertinent parcel in the absence of the other. An emergency situation shall be defined as the failure of any shared portion of the system to deliver water upon demand.

10. That only those parcels of real estate herein above described and the dwellings located thereon shall be permitted to receive water from said well and pumping equipment; and each of the parties hereto does hereby covenant and agree that he/she will not allow or permit other persons, other than household guests, to take, draw, use or receive water from the well, nor permit other persons to connect to the pipes or mains serving his/her respective parcel.

12. That in the event the referenced well shall become contaminated and shall no longer supply water suitable for domestic consumption, or shall no longer supply water adequate for the needs of all relevant parties, or in the event that another source of water shall become available to the respective parcels, then the rights and

obligations of the parties created by this Agreement shall cease and terminate in accordance with the terms and conditions hereinafter described.

13. That upon the availability of such other source of water, it is contemplated that a reasonable time shall be allowed to effectuate the necessary connections to the new source.

14. That the respective rights and obligations of the parties shall continue until the parties who wish to terminate their participation in the Well Agreement have executed and filed a written statement of termination at the Office of the Register of Deeds of the County of Bell, State of Texas, and with Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District. Upon termination of participation in this Agreement, the owner and occupant of each residence which is terminated from the Agreement shall have no further right to the use of the well. The terminated parties shall disconnect their respective lateral connection from said well system and shall have no further obligation to pay or collect for maintenance and related expenses incurred thereafter. The costs of disconnection from the well and water system shall be borne by the owner of the pertinent parcel.

15. That the undersigned parties shall permit periodic well water sampling and testing by a responsible authority at the request of an undersigned party, and the Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District when deemed necessary.

16. That the said well and this Agreement, if amended, shall serve no more than two single family dwelling units and the assigned parcels, notwithstanding the ability of the parties to make other amendments to this Agreement.

17. That the parties may amend this Agreement to assure equitable distribution of shared costs and responsibilities; however, this Agreement may not be amended unless first reviewed and approved by the Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District.

18. That the term of this Agreement shall be perpetual, except as herein limited.

20. That the benefits and burdens of this Agreement shall constitute a covenant running with the parcels of land herein described and shall be binding upon the heirs, successors in title and assigns of the parties hereto.

Encumbrance:

Any beneficial use of the Water Rights shall be by way of transfer of the permitted withdrawal rights to withdrawal points on lands which do not belong to Grantor.

Exceptions to Conveyance and Warranty:

- 1. The Water Rights conveyed herein are subject to any existing limitations, restrictions, proportional adjustments, applicable rules or other conditions now in effect or which may be adopted or imposed by the Clearwater Underground Water Conservation District, including but not limited to the limitations and conditions to the rights to withdraw and beneficially use water as recited in the Permit.
- 3. Any physical aspect of the water including but not limited to: availability, existence, utility, recoverability, source, quality, condition, potability, chemistry, or other characteristics of water, if any, lying on, under, or over the land or lands or that may be produced or used from the land or lands.

Exceptions to Conveyance and Warranty:

Grantor, for the Consideration and subject to the Reservations from Conveyance and the Exceptions to Conveyance and Warranty, grants, sells, assigns, transfers and conveys to Grantee the Groundwater Rights, together with all and singular the rights, whether real or personal, and appurtenances thereto in any way belonging, to have and to hold it to Grantee and Grantee's successors and assigns forever. Grantor binds Grantor and Grantor's successors and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the Property to Grantee and Grantee's successors and assigns against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof when the claim is by, through, or under Grantor but not otherwise, except as to the Reservations from Conveyance and the Exceptions to Conveyance and Warranty.

Commencement, Duration and Termination of Easement:

Acceptance of this Encumbrance Agreement by the Grantor and Grantee shall be signified by (i) the Grantor and Grantees signatures below, and this Encumbrance Agreement being recorded along with the attached notice in the property records of Bell County, Texas.


